PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

WHAT DO I WANT TO DO IN 2019?

What do I want to do in 2019? Who do I have to be to create it? What are you creating in 2019? Who will you need to be?

It's that time of year again when I evaluate what goals I want to set for the New Year. My goals need to be reasonable and reachable. The first goals that attracted me for 2019 came in my email from Memorial Hermann. They were inviting me and many others to join them in a five- week goal plan. Week one is to refresh your diet into a healthy meal plan that tastes good. Week two asks that you recharge your workout. Week three is to be spent rekindling your relationships. Week four is to renew your mind by unplugging and recharging by finding concrete ways to relax. The plan ends with week five wanting you to rediscover your city by following a calendar of events exploring a list of spots that will inspire you.

I also think about leadership. We learn leadership as we go. We likely will never feel

100% ready, eager, prepared, skilled, or proficient to lead. Nonetheless, a leader is a person willing and able to influence behavior. Leaders have solid skill sets that can be relied upon for the task being undertaken. The leader must be capable of either doing the task or able to secure the aid of those who can. Leaders focus toward the goal and should lead by example and have a positive outlook about a project's outcome. A good leader listens to feedback to find out what's working, what's not, where we had the impact we wanted, and where we didn't. What's most important about the feedback is what we do with it. What needs working on, then what will shift the results so that things are better the next time.

So, are you willing and able to influence behavior?

We are influencing others all the time anyway, so wouldn't it be wonderful to do so intentionally?

Since 1990, we have contributed over \$298,000 to more than 80 local schools and community nonprofit organizations for 182 educational projects for adults and students from pre-school to college age, including high school summits. 

Fellowship Fund Report

In August of 2018, the North Harris County AAUW Fellowship Fund Committee notified over fifty local 501c (3) organizations that it was accepting applications for STEM-focused grant proposals. In October we received 17 grant applications requesting a total of \$65,476.63. The Fellowship Fund Committee Vice-Presidents and the Branch president screened the applications and eliminated those which were not STEM-related, over budget or incomplete. The committee members then personally interviewed the remaining applicants about their projects. The committee has met and selected several finalists which will be submitted to the NHC AAUW Executive Board for final approval. Your Fellowship Fund Vice-Presidents are very excited about our finalists and can't wait to award \$28,900 to our local recipients at the Outstanding Women's Luncheon in March.

Fellowship Fund Committee members have also completed three visits with 2018 grant recipients. We shared our visit with the CASA4Kids (Teaching Enthusiasm for Reading to Girls in the Foster Care System) earlier in the fall. In November, we completed visits to the Maybelline Carpenter Center (Computer Coding at Carpenter Center) and the Barbara Bush Library (FASCINATION Station: A Mobile STEM and Maker Center.)
