At the January Board of Director's meeting, the Board spent time going over our goals which were set last August. As you remember, this year we completely revamped our goals, making them ones that were closer to our mission statement and what we truly wanted to accomplish or bring about. We made our goals action goals and measurable so half way through the year, it was time to see where we were. Good news. We are well on our way to attaining most of our goals. There are a few which are still on the back burner and may have to be reconsidered for next year. Let me give you a short report card.

**MEMBERSHIP**: Our membership is at 144 and our goal is 147 by June. We will all renew in the next few months and will need to encourage new members.

<u>Goals A &B</u>: Attract New Members-we are doing well at publicizing the programs; and the excellent programs themselves bring in new members. Our many and varied interest groups also attract new members. We need to remember to provide transportation, especially at night, for members who cannot drive at night to functions and interest groups.

**ADVOCACY:** Ensure NHC AAUW members and the local public are informed about important issues critical to the equity of women and girls. <u>Goals A & B:</u> We have had a poster session at each branch meeting and articles in the *Nutshell* on specific public policy issues such as School Safety, Equal Pay, Title IX, Title VII. We missed the month of January on Higher Education. **Goal C:** Ongoing. Members should have hours in by June 30, 2019.

**EDUCATION** - Address the barriers that hamper the advancement of women and girls.

Goal A: Not in progress now.

<u>Goal B:</u> Plan and coordinate Summits at local high schools. Summit planned but cancelled at Klein Forest High School; Summit conducted at Windfern High School.

Goal C: Fellowship Fund Committee has met, and Board has voted to award \$28,000 to 501(c) 3 organizations that foster STEM skills and build interest in technology among female students. Goal D: Investigate Work Smart- In progress PHILANTHROPHY - Support NHC fundraising efforts which enable us to provide opportunities for women and girls through grants, scholarships, special projects, and the Legal Advocacy Fund. <u>Goal A:</u> In progress: All have to do with increasing the participation in OWL <u>Goal B:</u> We met the goal of \$1500 for the Legal Advocacy Fund

<u>Goal C:</u> Explore the possibility of new fundraisers. In progress.

If you have read through these, you can see, we are well on our way to meeting our goals. Way to go, NHC!

#### Meeting Our Honorees

Debbie Johnson feels called to serve. When HIV/AIDS struck Houston, she chaired a hands-on ministry for persons with those infections. As the outreach director of St. Dunstan's Episcopal Church, she has overseen 40 ministries. She leads a ministry to serve the Lakota Indians of South Dakota. In North Harris County, she is the co-founder and president of the board of 1960 Hope Center that serves our homeless population. Debbie is an involved alumna of the University of Texas and an officer of the Willowbrook Rotary Club. The Superlady Live Movement will honor Debbie this year for making the community stronger.

Kati Woodward is an educator whose influence spread beyond a traditional classroom. When students in her first classes missed school to babysit with younger siblings, Kati began an effort that resulted in the establishment of a day care center for that community. She sponsored a Model United Nations Club to expose high school students to international affairs. For area high schools, she created high school Summits reaching over 7,700 girls through programs that support the AAUW Mission Statement. Kati and her husband were founders of the Cypress Creek Emergency Medical Services (CCEMS) that serves over 550,000 persons in North Harris County.

#### In Memoriam

Former NASA executive Nancy Grace Roman, often described as the "mother" of the Hubble Space Telescope, died in December 2018 at age 93. A longtime employee of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Roman was the first woman to hold an executive role at NASA. After getting her Ph.D. in astronomy from the University of Chicago in 1949, she joined NASA in 1959 as its first Chief of Astronomy in the Office of Space Science where she remained until her retirement in 1979. Roman is also remembered for her work in bolstering career opportunities for women through the American Association of University Women,

the Washington Post reported.
