Fellowship Fund News - October 2019

The search for Fellowship Fund grant recipients for the 2019-2020 membership year has begun. Over 100 requests for grant proposals have been emailed to local 501(c)(3) organizations and five local school districts – Aldine, Cy-Fair, Klein, Spring, and Tomball. If you know of organizations or teachers who might be interested in applying, the grant documents are available online at our branch website – http://nharriscounty-tx.aauw.net (under Community Grant tabs) – or from Elizabeth Wilson – elizabethwilson.aauw@gmail.com . 2019-2020 grants will be awarded at the Outstanding Women's Luncheon on February 29, 2020.

Since 1990 the North Harris County AAUW Fellowship Fund has contributed more than \$450,000 to local and national projects. Locally, 21 community service organizations have received \$80, 905; 4 county libraries (Aldine, Barbara Bush, Atascocita, and Northwest Branch) \$56,417; Aldine ISD - \$5915; Cy-Fair ISD - \$58,416; Klein ISD - \$77,323; Spring ISD - \$29,177. We hope to fund at least one Tomball ISD project this grant cycle. Nationally, the branch has completed endowments for the Virginia R. Lyon American Fellowship and North Harris County Research and Projects grants. We have also contributed to three additional American Fellowships in honor of Barbara Jordan, Lynette K. Solomon, and Ann Richards; in addition, we have contributed to the Eleanor Roosevelt Fund. Our contributions to the Legal Advocacy Fund are not included in these calculations but will be in our next annual tally.



TEP was established in 1996 with the major focus of socializing students to normative standards in terms of interpersonal skills with peers and adults, to teach classroom behaviors that promote learning, and to encourage problem solving skills that eschew violent and aggressive strategies.

Today TEP provides special education services for approximately 100-120 students at a time. All ages are served, from kindergarten to post-secondary.



North Harris County AAUW has a new service project – stitching Snuggle Buddies for neonatal intensive care patients at Texas Children's Hospital. What is a Snuggle Buddy? New NHC AAUW member, Teaghan Bush, a Child Life Specialist in the NICU, says Snuggle Buddies are soft flannel hearts that mothers tuck into their bras to absorb their skin scents. After returning the Snuggle Buddies to their babies' nursing staff, they are placed in isolettes to provide comfort to the baby when it is undergoing painful/stressful medical procedures. In addition, the Snuggle Buddy also supports bonding between baby and mother.

How can you help? You can sew, you can cut, you can donate flannel scraps or yardage, and/or you can donate money to purchase flannel. Elaine Volz and Elizabeth Wilson can provide heart patterns if you are interested in participating.
