Usually, North Harris County takes a break over the summer. This is not a traditional year.


Several activities are tentatively planned for June. PLEASE check your email as we will let you know new developments as soon as we have information.

Since the Covid-19 virus outbreak required that the in-person convening in Pflugerville be cancelled, it proceeded as a virtual event on Facebook and Zoom. The day started with a "State of the Union" from President Malinda Gaul and ended with a Zoom Virtual Awards and Happy Hour.

During the day, the North Harris County Branch of the Association of University Women was recognized in the following ways:

- Three of our members were elected to the board of Texas AAUW. Margie Poole as Fund VP, Mary Smith as Secretary, and Betsy Calabro as the South District Representative
- We received the MAP Award (see below). Our branch donated to the Tyler Branch 75th Anniversary Fellowship.
- Mary Smith was recognized for being nominated by the branch as our nominee for the 2020 Outstanding Member.
- Three NHC members were named "Sister Suffragists" for donating \$100 or more to the Greatest Needs Fund during this AAUW membership year. They are Emily Hackler, Mary Smith, and Kati Woodward.
- We received these AAUW Funds Awards for donations from branch members. For the year 2018, we were #2 in the Top 10 branches for dollar amount and #6 for per capita donations. For the year 2019, we placed #1 in the Top 10 for dollar amount contributed and #3 for per capita donations.
