

UNITED STATES MAGISTRATE JUDGE YVONNE HO

Yvonne was sworn in as Judge in March 2022. She is the first Asian American ever appointed to the federal bench in Houston, Texas. She counts herself as a native Houstonian after moving here with her family in fifth grade and graduating from Klein High School in 1989.

Long before pursuing a legal career, Judge Ho was a classical pianist, obtaining a Bachelor of Music degree from Rice University and a Master of Music degree from the University of Southern California. After switching careers, she obtained her juris doctorate from the University of Houston Law Center, where she graduated as valedictorian of her class. During her studies Judge Ho received a P.E.O. Scholars award from AAUW national.

Judge Ho has been married for 27 years to Allen Rice. They have a son Nicholas who is 24. She has a personal connection to NHC AAUW: her mother-in-law is the late Marjorie Rice, a longtime and devoted member of the organization.

Nancy received a Ph.D. in Entomology from the University of Illinois and a master's in library science from Dominican University. She worked 25 years for Harris County Public Library, retiring as Librarian of Barbara Bush branch. In retirement she served on community boards such as Pearl Fincher Museum of Fine Arts, the Barbara Bush Library Friends, and the Cypress Creek Christian Community Center. Currently, she serves as the President of Spring Interfaith Council, where volunteers work together to promote understanding among diverse faith communities.

Teresa began her career as a middle school social studies teacher before being promoted to assistant principal and director of instruction. In 2005, she entered district leadership, serving as a director, assistant, and associate superintendent, and eventually named CFISD's chief of staff in 2012. Her achievements include organizing planning committees for two successful bond referendums, as well as developing multi-layered safety and security plan. She and her husband Bob have three grown sons.
